Diagnostic Reports

At the 'Meet the Teacher' event all parents will receive a short report. There will be a short pastoral comment from your child's class teacher indicating how they have settled into Waihi life; an Attitudes and Habits report and a short diagnostic listing the results of your child's initial PAT assessments. Whilst the majority of the first few weeks are about getting the environment in and out of the classroom right, and making the children feel happy and secure in their new surroundings, there will also be a few small diagnostic tests.

Our rationale for the initial testing is threefold:

□ To give a baseline from which to report progress (children will have matching assessments later this year)

- To help in the initial grouping, setting and differentiating of children' learning objectives and tasks
- $\hfill\square$ Assisting in the identification of learning support and extension needs






