FROM THE HEADMASTER'S DESK

Dear Parents,

These past few weeks have been a microcosm of life at Waihi, with our pupils having engaged in a variety of experiences that, for me, highlight the breadth and vibrancy of the Waihi experience. The Year 7 Camp to Abel Tasman was fantastic; we have hosted visiting sports teams from Hawkes Bay and Christchurch. Over a quarter of the school participated in the Agri-Kids sections at the 150th Winchester Show. We had riders at various events, including the Wanaka Show. Some Year 8 students have been out at leadership training, and the YMCA team has helped Mr Clayson in health lessons. Many senior students have been off visiting prospective senior schools for Open Days and interviews, and the feedback has been tremendous.

Our children seem to be heading in all directions and are engaged in many activities outside of the classroom, all of which add to the richness of school life. Isn't it strange, then, that we live in a society that often choses to judge school performance on a somewhat narrower set of criteria? Such activities recorded above may not be reported on any league tables of 'top schools' but in our view, they are vital parts of a well-rounded prep school education.

As a parent of children who have been at independent schools, I believe the quality of the education which my sons and daughters receive is not just determined by their exam scores, however important they may be. I want them to feel good in their own skin; to be happy; to have good self-esteem; to have a variety of artistic, cultural, and sporting opportunities; to explore the world in a hands-on way and for the school to instil the values of humility, graciousness and respect for themselves, for those around them.

Our young Waihians are learning the value of doing one's best, taking on challenges, perseverance, and hard work. They are constantly encouraged to meet the high expectations the staff (and parents) have of them, but nothing is more powerful than their own internal motivation and the expectations and aspirations they have themselves.

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Well done, team Waihi. I am very proud of you all, and I am looking forward to introducing our new headmaster, Mr Wood, to Waihi as he spends the next three days with us.
