FROM THE HEADMASTER'S DESK

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Welcome back to the beginning of term two.

The school has come alive once again with the energetic return of our students, who have clearly enjoyed reconnecting with their friends and staff over the past two days. On Monday evening, I was fortunate to meet with some of our returning boarding families; the buzz and excitement in Pyne House was electric!

Yesterday morning, we held our ANZAC service. Before the holidays, I challenged the students to return looking smart and tidy in their Number 1 uniform with polished shoes. I am pleased to say they rose to the occasion and looked extremely impressive. Taking pride in our appearance is a simple but meaningful way to show respect during this important service. We were privileged to be joined by Peter Orchard, who, alongside Archie Morrow, prepared the shells and assisted selected students in firing the 6-pdr, 700 cwt anti-tank gun — a historic piece generously donated by the Harper family, which now sits proudly outside our school museum.

Winter sports are now underway, with practices and matches beginning this week. On Sunday, our rugby players had their first outing at the Pleasant Point 10's tournament. Waihi fielded two teams — one in the Year 7 grade and another in the Year 8 grade — in addition to several younger students representing their local clubs. I am delighted to report that both teams performed remarkably well. The Year 7 team finished as runners-up after a narrow loss in the final, while the Year 8 team went unbeaten throughout, winning their final convincingly without conceding a try. All players conducted themselves with pride and represented Waihi School with distinction.

As winter sports ramp up, a reminder about our expectations for both players and supporters:

Players are expected to:

- Train and play hard, but always by the rules.
- Never argue with the referee. Any necessary questions should be directed through the captain or coach.
- Acknowledge and celebrate positive contributions from teammates and opponents.

- Treat others as you would like to be treated.
- Cooperate with coaches, teammates, and opponents without them, there is no game.
- Win with humility and lose with dignity.

Supporters are expected to:

- Remember that children participate in sport for their enjoyment.
- Understand that inappropriate behaviour reflects poorly on your child, the team, and Waihi School.
- Applaud good play from both teams.
- Condemn all forms of sideline negativity.
- Respect the referee's decisions.
- Encourage players to play within the rules.
- Remain off the field, dugouts, and team benches unless invited by the coach.

Thank you for your ongoing support of Waihi School and our students as they strive to do their best in all areas of school life. I look forward to seeing many of you on the sidelines in the weeks ahead!
