FROM THE HEADMASTER'S DESK

Dear Parents, Caregivers, and Friends of Waihi,

Welcome to Week three. While we are still very much in the heart of winter, with frosts and chilly mornings, the pace and energy around the school certainly hasn't slowed down. With the days slowly lengthening, and a few brave daffodils peeking through, it really does feel like we are edging closer to spring.

As Saturday sport begins to wind down, I want to thank you again for the tremendous support shown from the sidelines. The commitment of our students, coaches, and families has been unwavering, and as always, Waihi has been well represented across all codes. We wish our teams heading to Christchurch this Thursday for our fixture against Cathedral Grammar all the very best.

We have enjoyed a stunning run of winter weather, and it has been great to see so many students outside making the most of it. From lunchtime games of rugby, football, netball shooting and tag, to catching up with friends in the sunshine, there is a real sense of joy and connection in these everyday moments. Outdoor Education sessions have continued with great enthusiasm, and we've even had a few brave swimmers taking to the water for midwinter dips during their lessons, a true testament to their spirit and resilience (and perhaps a slightly questionable sense of temperature).

Our boarders continue to make the most of opportunities and experiences that make Waihi boarding life so special. 
