FROM THE HEADMASTER'S DESK

Dear Parents, Caregivers, and Friends of Waihi,

Welcome back! I trust the recent holidays provided a valuable opportunity for everyone to rest, reflect, and reconnect. It has been fantastic to have the school grounds buzzing with energy again, and particularly pleasing to see the students jump straight back into purposeful routines, with friendships picking up exactly where they left off.

A very warm welcome also to our four new permanent boarders and their families who have joined us this term: Imogen (Year 6), Archie (Year 7), Fred (Year 7), and Paige (Year 8). We are delighted to have you as part of the Waihi community, and we look forward to getting to know you all in the weeks ahead.

We also extend a warm welcome to our two Boarding Exchange students from Huntley School, Pippa and Fred, who joined us on Monday for the week. This exchange is part of a new initiative aimed at strengthening the relationship between two of New Zealand's leading preparatory schools. It is wonderful to have them here experiencing life at Waihi. We have also received great updates from Charlie and Maggie, who are currently enjoying their time up North at Huntley School as part of the exchange, they are certainly making the most of this unique opportunity!

Just before the holidays, I had the privilege of attending the ISNZ Conference, where one message was clear and resonated deeply with our values here at Waihi: the future of education is less about what students know and more about who they are. Predictions show that in the years ahead, soft skills – resilience, teamwork, adaptability, and empathy – will be the number one thing employers are looking for.

This struck a chord with me because, while technology has made life easier, it has also, ironically, removed many of the natural "social frictions" that once taught us perseverance and patience. Many of us remember waiting all week for the Friday night trip to the video store, only to find our favourite movie already rented, or worse, getting it home and discovering the tape didn't work. We had to knock on a friend's door and ask, "Can you come out to play?" rather than send a text. Even developing a roll of photos meant waiting days to see whether they had come out.

These small frictions were formative. They taught us to cope with disappointment, to compromise, and to try again, all skills our young people still need to learn, even if the context is different.

At Waihi, we are intentional about giving students the chance to learn these lessons. The back end of Term 3 was filled with opportunities where students have been challenged, and in doing so, have shown us who they are:

Grandparents' Day was a beautiful example of this. The hall was packed to the brim (we even ran out of chairs), and there was a real sense of connection as students proudly toured their grandparents around the school and then played house football matches in front of them. It was a reminder that heritage, continuity, and family involvement are still at the heart of what we do.

- The Year 8 Otago Rail Trail camp provided some real "grit moments." They faced challenging conditions but showed determination, teamwork, and humour throughout, supporting one another and returning home tired but proud of what they had achieved. Their resilience was truly impressive.
- We also received a lovely email from a parent following the Aoraki Maths Competition. She
 was writing to thank our Year 7 team, who, after finishing the competition, stopped to
 congratulate another school for coming second. Her daughter was surprised at their kindness
 and sportsmanship, and said their positive attitude made an impact. While it is a shame that
 such moments stand out as unusual, it is a testament to the character of our students and the
 values we strive to instil at Waihi.
- Boarding life continues to be a cornerstone of how we grow soft skills here. Living alongside others requires compromise, collaboration, and learning how to resolve differences—the very skills we know will serve these young people well long after they leave our gates.

The strength of character on display was also evident in our recent sporting and cultural successes:

- Koru Games Excellence: Congratulations to our teams on a superb Koru Games showing. The skills, dedication, and sportsmanship of our players resulted in outstanding achievements: Hockey 2nd, Netball 3rd, and Football 12th.
- Flava Festival: Our Kapa Haka group's performance at the Flava Festival was powerful and moving. The commitment of our students to their kapa haka group and their confident performance was a credit to them all.
- Flag Football National Qualification: Congratulations to our Year 7 Flag Football team, who are now regional champions and have qualified for the national tournament! We wish them the very best as they prepare to compete on the national stage.

All of these moments – from grandparents on the sidelines to students navigating gravel roads on a bike – are more than just activities on the calendar. They are our intentional opportunities to grow confident, capable young people who can thrive in a world that will expect them to adapt, empathise, and lead.

Wishing you all a positive and fulfilling remainder of the term ahead.
