FROM THE HEADMASTER'S DESK

Dear Parents, Caregivers, and Friends of Waihi,

Welcome to this edition of our school newsletter! The energy and purpose across school is high as we drive toward the end of the year. Our Year 8s are busy fine-tuning their production (a highlight of our cultural calendar) and both staff and students are actively preparing for the upcoming end-of-year assessments, focus and discipline are high. It is a true privilege to see our students engaging with all areas of school life.

On Monday in St John's Chapel, my message focused on a concept critical to that growth: Honesty and Integrity. I urged our students to become the Inner Architect of their own lives. I reminded them that every choice is a brick; using strong, true bricks, speaking the truth, owning mistakes, and keeping one's word, builds a foundation of character that is like a fortress. To give the students a tangible reminder of this, I gave each of them a simple, smooth Waihi river stone to keep on their person as a physical cue that the small, foundational, unseen choices are the ones that matter most. Just like the ancient Roman Roads, which lasted two thousand years due to their deep, solid foundation, those private choices determine the strength of the person who shows up in public. Our challenge is to remember that "The truest greatness lies in being always great, in little things."

We've officially transitioned into our summer sports calendar, and the engagement has been outstanding! We've seen great participation in Saturday cricket and tennis fixtures, and a fantastic energy for our first night of touch rugby on Monday. With 80% of our school involved in the touch competition, it's a wonderful sight to see so many Waihi students active and enjoying the festival atmosphere down at Geraldine High School. Thank you to our coaches and parents for their commitment to these teams.

Last Thursday, our entire school participated in the nationwide earthquake drill, 'ShakeOut'. These drills are a vital part of our school safety plan, reminding us all of the essential Drop, Cover, Hold action, and ensuring every student and staff member knows how to respond calmly in an emergency.

On a different note, we have also shared a well-being survey with our students this week. Gaining direct insight into their social, emotional, and learning experiences is critical, and the data will be invaluable in informing and refining our student support and pastoral care planning for the future. At Waihi, we really value a focus on wellbeing for students and staff as we can see that a positive, supportive environment is directly linked to high-quality learning and performance. When students and staff feel safe, supported, and connected, they are better equipped to face challenges, engage with their learning, and contribute positively to our school culture.

A final reminder to please RSVP for our Blokes' Brunch. This is a relaxed and meaningful opportunity for students to enjoy quality time with a significant male in their lives (whether that's a dad, stepdad, grandfather, uncle, or mentor).

The morning's schedule is set for Sunday, November 2nd: doors open at 8:00 am for brunch, followed by the 9:00 am kick-off for the All Blacks vs Ireland test match.


From the Headmaster's Desk (CONTINUED)
